- Caring for the elderly patients

- Struggling with noncommunicable (NCD's diseases) cancer, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, COPD etc.)
- Dealing with mental health problems (depression, anxiety etc.)
- Family doctor as a drug (doctor-patient relationship "mutual investment bank")
- Managing and distributing the humanitarian aid
- Keeping resilience in the condition of the war (missile attacks, air alarms)
- Many of our colleagues deliver medical care at the frontline of the battlefield

Expanding Services, Strengthening Quality and Patient-Centeredness in PHC Centers

Quality Management system plan development (Created quality groups, developed the strategy of the development of QMS for 5 years, vision, mission and values, Code of Ethics)

Strengthening PHC teams to deliver services (conducted the staff training on patient-centeredness and priority services.

Training of doctors - lectures on HIV and tuberculosis, primary mental health, peer groups, primary pregnancy management.

Created orders for the center to implement patient pathways using international clinical recommendations.

An analysis of the functionality of MIS and social media was carried out, a report on the necessary changes was made.

PATIENT-CENTERED APPROACH

- Implemented the regular feedback from patients. Created a questionnaire and conducted survey.
- Conducted diabetes school.
- Conducted lectures for teenagers "Healthy girl healthy generation", "From physiological needs to physiology".

EXPANSION OF SERVICES AT THE PHC LEVEL

- The new services of nurse were introduced.
- Quality indicators have been put into effect.
- "Medical assistance to tuberculosis patients" and "Approval of legal acts on protection against HIV infection during professional duties" trainings were held.
- Purchased new equipment and devices (a venous scanner, monoblocs, additional MIS workplaces, devices for putting on shoe covers, billirubinometer, magnetic model of the body with internal organs, boxes for feedback etc.)
- a photo session of the medical staff was carried out

- Improving our knowledge and skills (POCUS Trainings, Mental Health Trainings (mhGAP by WHO), TCCC Trainings, Communication skills etc.)
- Creating the space of communication (nationally and internationally)
- Searching the better ways to serve for the patients

- Dealing with burnout syndrome





DURING THE WAR IN UKRAINE OUR HEALTHCARE SYSTEM HAS FACED WITH NUMEROUS CHALLENGES AND PROBLEMS

ACCORDING TO MINISTRY OF HEALTH RUSSIANS HAVE COMPLETELY DESTROYED ALMOST 200 MEDICAL FACILITIES IN UKRAINE, 1218 FACILITIES HAVE BEEN DAMAGED. IN PARTICULAR, 540 HOSPITALS HAVE BEEN PARTIALLY DESTROYED, 173 – COMPLETELY, AND 593 PHARMACIES HAVE BEEN DAMAGED.

HEALTHCARE WORKERS



- Big challenge for our healthcare workers, esp. for the medical staff of our clinic
- We must work under pressure, dealing with vulnerable categories of patients, struggling for the health and life despite the lack of resources, uncertainty and very often in not safe environment
- Our team members are investing in care to support equitable outcomes
- Despite this difficult time, we try to extend our care for the patients



PATIENTS

- Many Ukrainian people lost their homes and must travel regions to the safer regions and even abroad
- We have many patients with mental disorders (depression, anxiety, posttraumatic stress disorder)
- We should work with double efforts creating a good patient centered atmosphere, developing empathy and compassion
- Especially in our clinic we develop communication skills of our doctors, establishing doctor-patient relationship based on trust

ORGANIZATION

- We helped our colleagues from the regions of Ukraine that were directly suffered by the war
- We offered the access to the medical electronic record system
- We organized online consultations with our colleagues abroad, helping the most difficult patients

- At our clinic we change from the current health care system, which is built around diseases and institutions, to a system designed for people's everyday life
- We have found many opportunities to collaborate with our foreign colleagues

MEDICAL NEUTRALITY MUST BE OBSERVED IN UKRAINE

The World Medical Association (WMA) and the Standing Committee of European Doctors (CPME) express deep concern about the conflict in Ukraine initiated by the Russian Federation and strongly stress that the international principle of medical neutrality and human rights must be respected.

Prof. Dr Frank Ulrich Montgomery, Chair of Council of the World Medical Association, said "The World Medical Association deplores the unprecedented aggression in Ukraine by the Russian leadership. It calls on Russian leaders to respect the work of doctors and nurses in the country and the neutrality of health care institutions. Our thoughts are with Ukrainian colleagues and we appeal for a speedy end to hostilities."

Following reports of the shelling of a hospital in the Donetsk region, we emphasise that medical facilities must not be military targets, doctors and healthcare workers must not be prevented from performing their professional duties, and all efforts must be made to ensure that patients and casualties have full access to healthcare.

Preventing doctors from providing medical care to patients, or sanctioning them for doing so, contravenes international law as enshrined in conventions the Russian Federation has committed to observe.

Dr Christiaan Keijzer, President of the Standing Committee of European Doctors, said "We condemn any act of aggression that prevents doctors and healthcare professionals carrying out their duty of care to protect lives. European doctors stand in solidarity with their Ukrainian colleagues who are now working in the centre of the conflict and urge the swift end to all military aggression."

Following the Russian Federation's infiltration into Ukraine on the 24th of February, the European Forum of Medical Associations (EFMA) has issued the following statement.

The European Forum of Medical Association (EFMA) is increasingly concerned about the current conflict in Ukraine and reminds of the importance of adhering to and implementing rules of international humanitarian law protecting civilians and combatants, as well as medical, nursing and other health and humanitarian personnel.

EFMA is greatly concerned for the safety and well-being of all civilians impacted by this conflict both in terms of casualties and in addition to the increasing damage to already delicate health systems.

EFMA condemns any attacks directed at health personnel or health facilities and calls for the assurance that ambulances, health facilities or other structures which facilitate the work of health personnel are not targeted by military forces.

We are continuing to see the consequences of this conflict on civilians with an increasing number of refugees crossing the borders. We call for all countries to ensure that these displaced persons receive appropriate medical care when required.

EFMA stands in solidarity with our colleagues in Ukraine and urges to immediately end the conflict.

Cadus e.V. to build a (digital) crewing and screening system to send the doctors
to Ukraine - both through financial and project management support.

Lighthouse Ukraine is a day of encounter that brings together refugees and volunteers, NGOs and the public sector. NGOs, public administration and businesses offer direct access to help on topics such as finding housing and work, health care, day care and schooling.

The Alliance4Ukraine has already successfully organised lighthouses in 10 cities with over 25,000 visitors (e.g., Berlin, Barcelona, London, San Francisco).
