Welcome

On behalf of all the UK nations and the incredible Programme Advisory Committee, we wish you a very warm welcome to the 2024 International Forum on Quality and Safety in Healthcare.

We hope that this conference gives you learning from the very best quality and safety improvement work, as well as opportunities to reenergise, re-connect and make new friends.

The conference itself is being held in Newham - the most diverse borough in the country. Over 7 in 10 residents in Newham are from black and minority ethnic groups. Here you can hear over 220 languages and dialects.

We hope the conference will mirror this diversity – in the content, the range of speakers and the involvement of people with lived experience.

Newham also has one of the youngest population profiles in the country. 36% of the population is under 25.

We both feel very privileged to have attended many International Forums over the years. These events have been a source of learning, kinship and sustenance for us.






